

#### News from Dianne's Grade 6/7 Class



Tavis - Snow Days because we had no school on Thursday and Friday.


Lucille - I enjoyed the Yayuma because I love to dance. It just calms my spirit down and it's one of my favourite things to do.

Neshaun - Snow days, skiing and our novel - Island of the Blue Dolphins




#### News from Jen's Grade 4/5 Class

The students are amazing with the language. They have goals of being fluent speakers! They practice with our lovely Elders every week.
























- Happy Birthday Takoda! He's our oldest student.


We are continuing to learn about animals and their babies and seasonal changes in our world. It is beautiful to see our children's sense of joy and wonder as they explore our wonderful home.






