

Our class has been exploring electricity and circuits with conductive play-doh and insulating clay.


News from Michelle's Grade 2/3 Class




News from Sheri-An's Kindergarten Class

We explain to all the sasam our Gwayi'le'las (our bakwam ways) is a way of life, singing and dancing and ceremony is a part of our rich culture however, our Gwayi'le'las (our bakwam ways) is in everything we do, how we conduct ourselves, how we treat one another everyday. Every class we talk a lot about our teachings of maya'xala, hutlilala. The learning never stops.

The sasam are working diligently on their <u>Kangex</u>tola - their small paper blanket.

We have had our Elders & Chiefs, spend time with us

News from Physical Education with Sara





































Fun Fair


