years!




News from Dianne's Grade 6/7 Class

If this month is any indication, 2023 is shaping up to be a great year!












News from Leslee's Grade 4/5 Class

Happy New Year!







This new year has our Cultural program super busy and fun! This year we have developed a great routine for our class, starting with a prayer in bakwamkala and practicing our "word of the week" in bakwamkala relating to Pasa words and the gangananam are doing so well with our beautiful language.



We have started sewing our kangextola dlu tsep with the grade 6 and 7's students. The gangananam are doing so well at threading a needle, sewing buttons, and are enjoying making their own regalia. The grade 5 students are working on art, starting with ovoids, and creating their own art piece on paper. We have some great artists! The whole school has been working hard at learning our Kwakwaka'wakw culture ways, our legends, the hand movements of the dances they are learning in depth, the regalia that is used for each dance, and all of the important details of our beautiful culture. The gangananam have great Maya'xala and love for our culture and it shows with every class they attend.

I continue to be proud of our Gangananam for their pride in who they are as Kwakwaka'wakw and their motivation to learn! Keep it up Gangananam!


