Dianne's Grade 6/7 Class



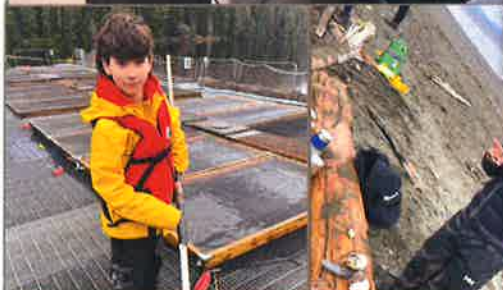

As you know the heart, spirit and hard work that goes into preparing for a potlatch - the gangan̄anam are busy in culture learning the deeper meaning of their dances and the teachings of our Mi'maya'an̄ and Potlatch people preparing for the Yayuma. The kids are focused on keeping the beat at the log during dance practice uplifting the teaching 'Naman's noke (we are of one heart).



The intermediate students are beginning a song book project - where we will compile the songs that we have learned this year. We are getting started on the K̄amk̄amd̄am Title pages where the gangan̄anam will draw pictures representing what the culture means to them. It has been a busy start to the year! FNHA Dental Therapist, Angela, visits the Health building once per month. Screening can happen at school (all ages), and dental services (X-rays, hygiene, anesthetic, restoration, crowns, extractions) can be performed in the Health Building's dentistry room!
