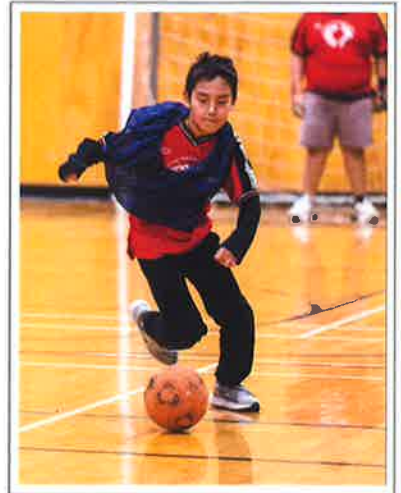

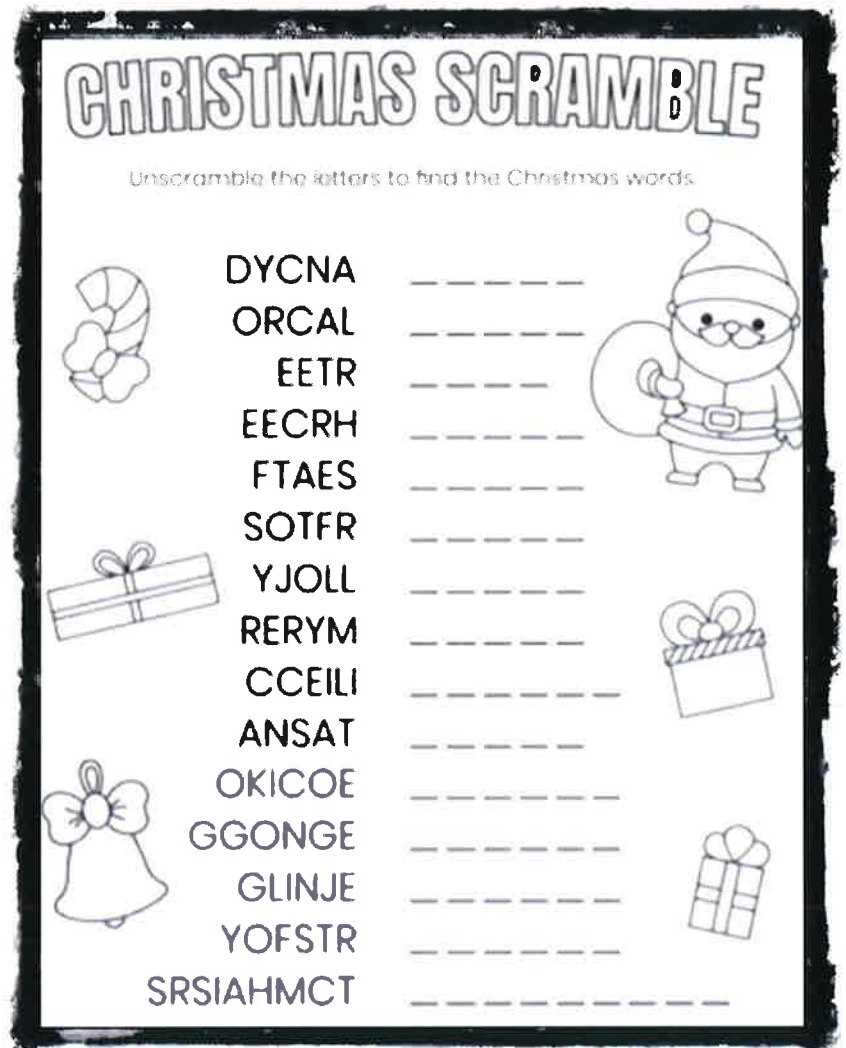
Gilakas'la Everyone,

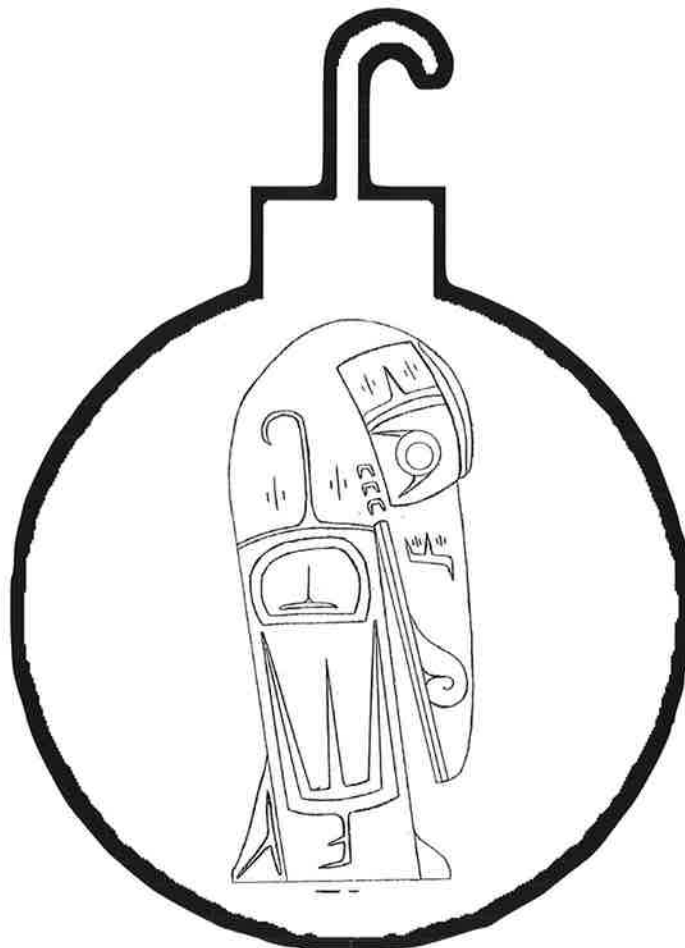
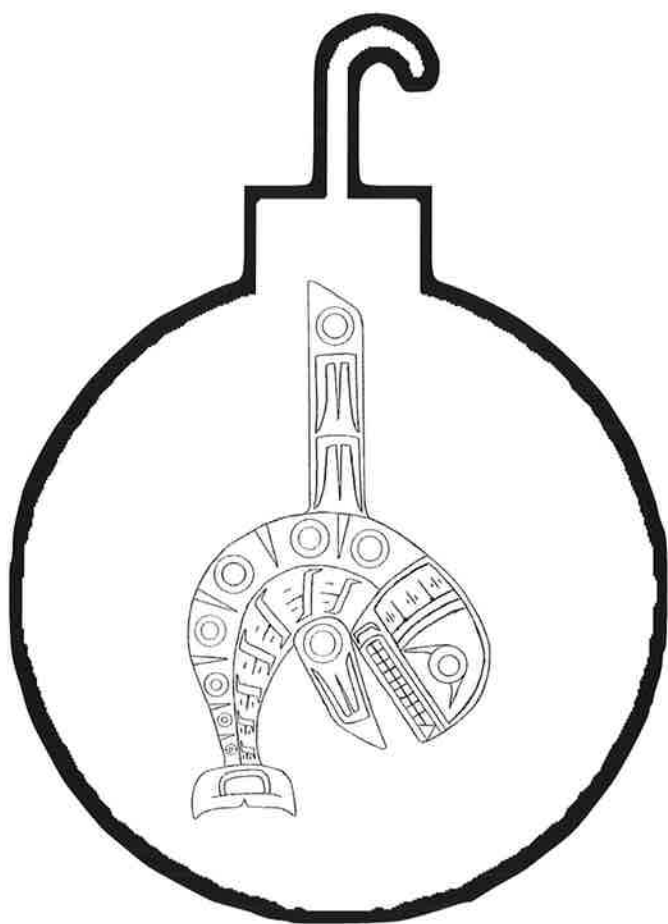
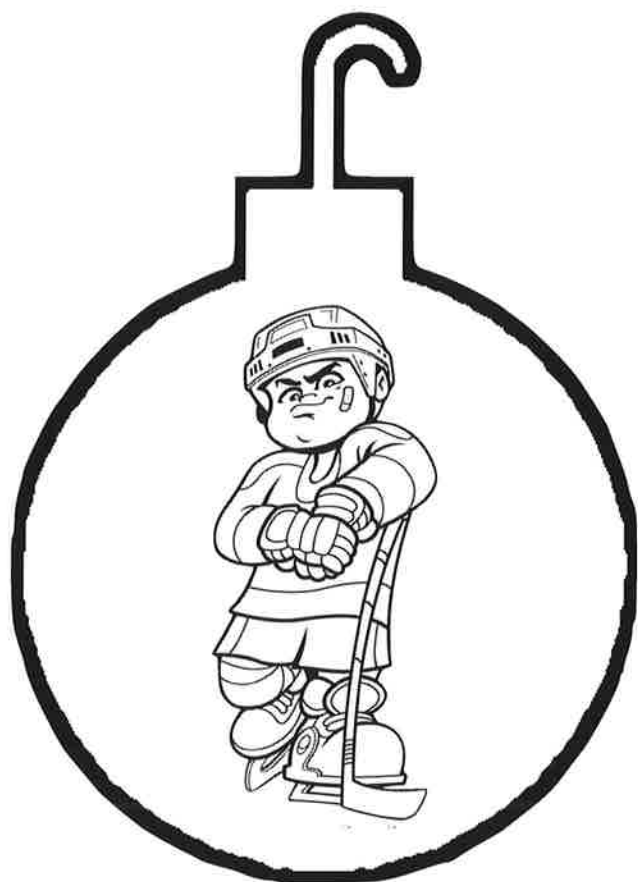
