
News from Karen











Michelle's Pre K Class: September











In culture, we have been focusing on drumming, singing and drum log etiquette which consists of keeping the beat at a steady pace, beating as one heart and learning songs together. This is an ongoing and consistent teaching we uplift in the culture room.

The gangananam have been learning about the importance of the Potlatch, what it means to our people and why we do it. The students are the future Potlatch people – the future singers, the future dancers, the future backroom ladies, the future speakers, so on and so forth. It is important that we know and remember everyone has a place and a role within our Culture.

The gangananam are practicing foot work on the dance floor, hand movements for the Hamatsa and Tłalkwała. We have a had an amazing start to our year in the culture room dancing, singing, and learning about the ways of our Potlatch people.


News from Chef Sharon


